100 days and 300 exhibits from more than 20 countries on display in the Kohlenwäsche

The Smithsonian Institution, Berlin's urban drift, Weil am Rhein's Vitra Design Museum, and Düsseldorf/Hamburg's Projects/trendbüro group have put together a fascinating exhibition for ENTRY2006. The Kohlenwäsche at Zollverein has been renovated and transformed into a 7,000-square metre museum that will be the home of design/architectural perspectives and visions for 100 days. A total of 300 exhibits by designers and architects from all around the world will be on display on five different levels.

The exhibition will reflect the rich variety of life. It will focus on cities and towns, houses and flats, landscapes, parks and gardens, leisure areas and facilities, entertainment, information and communication systems, change and socialisation, the conspicuous and the inconspicuous, projections and virtual worlds, the visible and the invisible, skin, membranes and surfaces, archetypes and genetic research, nanotechnology and biotechnology, ethics and aesthetics.

Speakers

Ole Bouman is a cultural and architectural historian. He is editor-inchief of the experimental architecture magazine VOLUME.

Atelier Bow-Wow is a Tokyo-based architectural studio. With their collection of pet houses and hybrid architecture, the duo has created a new source of inspiration for building in places where space is at a premium. Atelier Bow-Wow will exhibit at the >Talking Cities< exhibition.

Prof. Dr. Ralph Bruder is the initiator and founding president of the Zollverein School of management and design.

Francesca Ferguson is the initiator and artistic director of urban drift, a transcultural platform for new trends in architecture, design, and urbanism. She is also the curator of the ENTRY exhibition >Talking Cities<.

El ultimo grito are Spanish designers Rosario Hurtado and Roberto Feo. They create award-winning experimental design in their London-based studio. El ultimo grito will exhibit at the >Talking Cities< exhibition.

Hubert Klumpner/Alfredo Brillenbourg initiated and ran a multidisciplinary Urban Think Tank for research into contemporary architecture and urbanism in Caracas. They are the authors of the inspiring book >Informal City<.

Muck Petzet is a Munich-based architect who conducts site-specific projects with innovative concepts for economic revaluation.

Boris Sieverts is a Cologne-based artist who runs an unconventional city travel agency with which he discovers hidden landscape qualities. He designed the project >Land for free< for the City of Essen as part of its bid to become the European Capital of Culture.

Fritz Straub is the CEO of the Deutsche Werkstätten Hellerau, Dresden. He reanimated the myth of the famous traditional company for interior architecture.
